

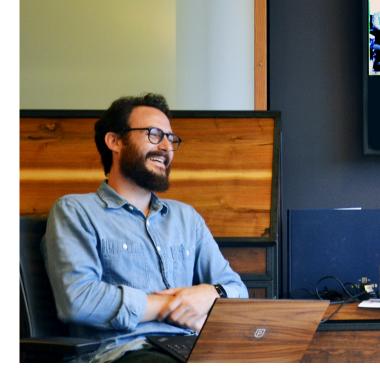

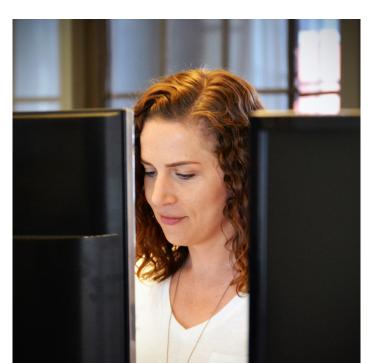

Propeller's diverse experience in project delivery and stakeholder management across various sectors includes a multitude of examples of how the firm has been able to amplify our clients' CSR efforts. Following is a sampling of projects that showcases our propensity to reach beyond our clients' bottom lines to achieve a greater good.













**CASE STUDY** 

## GOING PAPERLESS AT A FINANCIAL SERVICES COMPANY

The executive team of a national financial services company set the goal of moving 20 years of vital paper documents, which spanned 10 divisions and 1,400 employees, onto a digital platform within two years. Propeller was charged with the implementation and the development of governance structures, standardized reporting, coordinated business processes and employee training. The result of the engagement was a 40% increase in processing time and annual savings of over \$10 million.

#### **CASE STUDY**

## A LARGE SOFTWARE COMPANY IMPROVES THEIR EMPLOYEES' COMMUTES

The goal of the project was to develop a set of recommendations for a commuting solution that put employee values at the center of its design to unlock infrastructure constraints, reduce the company's carbon footprint, and save employees the hassle and expense of driving into work.

## FACILITATING BOARD EFFECTIVENESS AT LOCAL NONPROFIT

A large, local nonprofit added several new board members and underwent a shift in its strategic plan. Propeller led the nonprofit's leadership and key board members through an engaging organizational design that helped align the group on future strategy, vision and goals.

#### **CASE STUDY**

## A GLOBAL RETAILER INTRODUCES SUSTAINABLE POLYESTER INTO ITS SUPPLY CHAIN

Cross-functional teams comprised of experts from supply chain, sourcing, costing, analytics, product, and sustainability formulated a strategy on how to manufacture polyester products more sustainably. We explored alternative feedstocks (i.e. recycled bottles and recycled textiles), compared processes with the lowest carbon footprint, and identified which types of products (fleece) presented the largest opportunity.





**CASE STUDY** 

## DIVERSITY, INCLUSION, AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION AT AN EDUCATION SOFTWARE

We partnered with the Learning and Development and executive teams of an education software company to create a more inclusive and safer workplace environment following an acquisition.

Propeller provided two skilled practitioners to facilitate a half-day introductory workshop on fundamental Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) concepts and conflict styles.

## A GLOBAL RETAILER REDUCES HIGHLY REGULATED CHEMICALS IN THEIR SUPPLY CHAIN

The chemistry department set ambitious goals for making the brand's chemical footprint more sustainable. They enlisted Propeller to provide strategic direction and lead execution of the project.

Propel Her takes making a difference seriously. In 2017, three women founded our first gender diversity initiative, Propel Her. Propel Her is a woman-focused initiative launched to help women increase their presence, influence and professional partnerships in their communities and the workplace. Through its events and partnerships, Propel Her aims to provide guidance and tools that support female leaders, including mentorship, negotiations, conflict resolution, and leadership.

- Delivering a 6-month mentorship program aimed at supporting women through various aspects of their personal and professional growth.

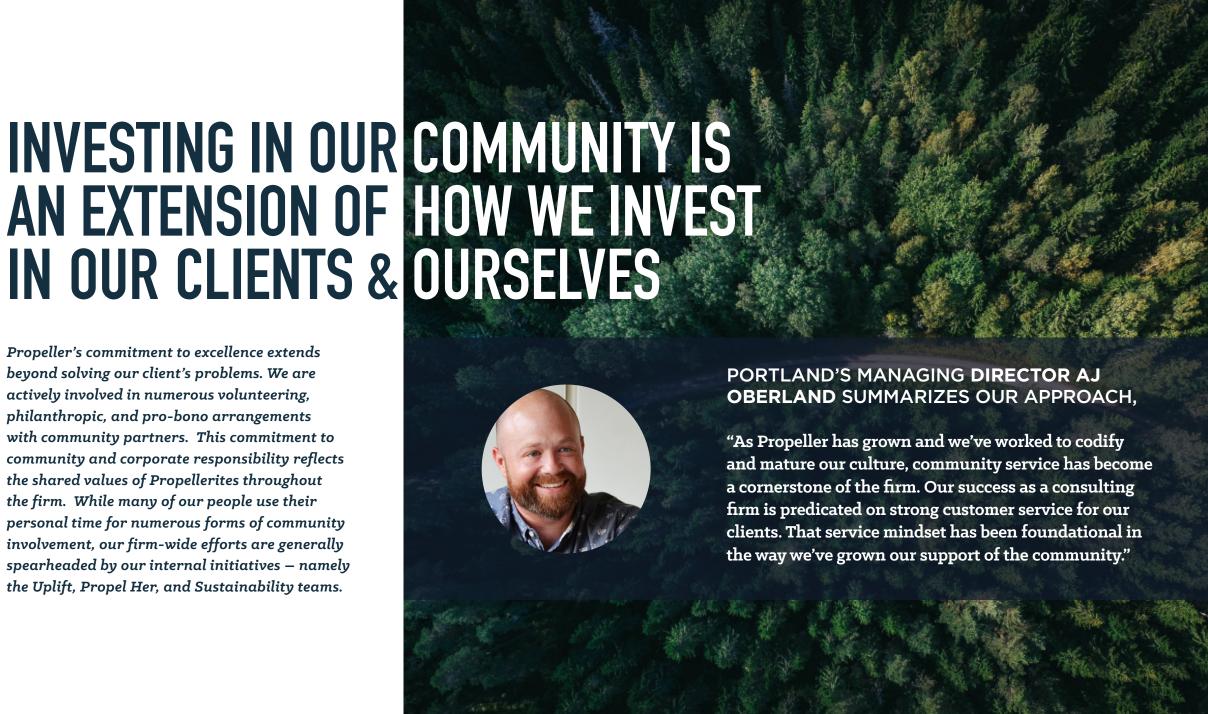






## AN EXTENSION OF HOW WE INVEST IN OUR CLIENTS & OURSELVES

#### **GIVING / PHILANTHROPY**

In addition to giving our time, the Propeller team is committed to giving to our community in meaningful ways. Through a \$50 employee match launched in 2017, we support organizations that inspire our team members. In 2018, roughly 40% of our employees participated in the matching program, allowing Propeller to contribute to 34 nonprofit organizations. Our employees also participate in annual school supply drives in each geography, and a giving tree for one of our key nonprofit partners.



#### **COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS**

Our strategic nonprofit partners, Mercy Corps NW, Impact NW, and Dress for Success are partnerships that have opened a wide range of opportunities for Propeller employees to get involved and use their skills. Here are just a few examples of how these partnerships come to life:

- Portland based Mercy Corps NW's goal is to invest in communities by supporting hopeful small business owners, unlocking possibilities for life after prison, and strengthening community resilience. In 2018, Propellerites contributed 550+ hours to strategy work, small business counseling, and facilitation.
- In San Francisco, Uplift partnered with Dress for Success to support their mission of empowering women to achieve economic independence. Propeller offers a complimentary skill set to Dress for Success's clients in preparing women with interview prep skills and professional development tools needed to succeed in their careers.







## ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

## HAVING A HYPER-LOCAL CONSULTING MODEL IS KEY TO OUR REDUCED ENVIRONMENTAL FOOTPRINT

Propeller strives to live and work holistically and responsibly while creating economic value within the confines of our environment and community. As a professional consulting services firm, our environmental impact is limited to the office space we occupy and the required transportation for client work. This report establishes a benchmark, namely in our greenhouse gas emissions, from which we can begin to develop strategic actions. As we continue to grow in employees and locations, we'll prioritize decisions in their impact against our greenhouse gas emissions and resource usage.



## GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS METRICS

As a growing firm, our greenhouse gas emissions are heavily correlated to our transportation footprint. While our Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions are limited to energy usage within our office (natural gas and electricity, respectively), our Scope 3 emissions — transportation — make up over 96% of our greenhouse gas profile.

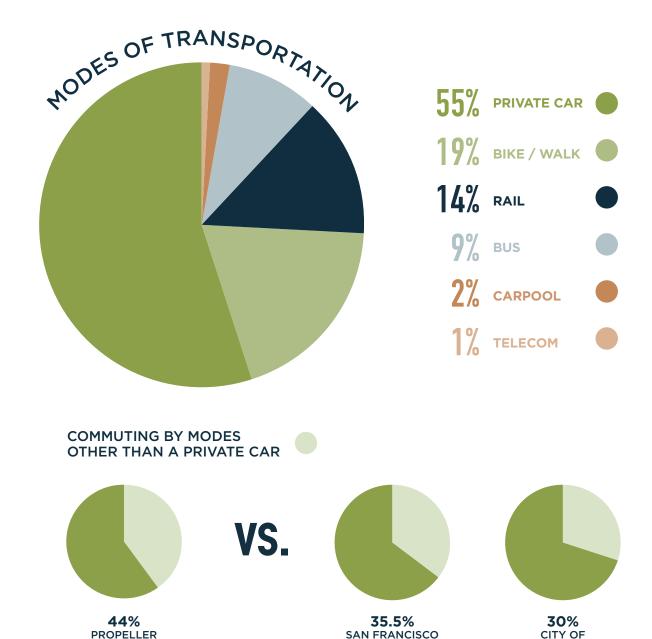




## **HOW WE COMMUTE**

As an initial benchmark, this will help us strategize going forward how we can better take advantage of telecommuting and virtual work, while further incentivizing urban mobility alternatives instead of private cars.

That said, ~44% of our staff company-wide commutes by modes other than a private car. Compared to recent municipal averages, this is 8.5 percentage points higher than the Bay Area average¹ and 14 percentage points higher than the Portland average². Nonetheless, transportation will be a strategic priority going forward, with the goal of reducing this emission total while growing the firm.

### Sustainability Certifications **SFO & PDX**

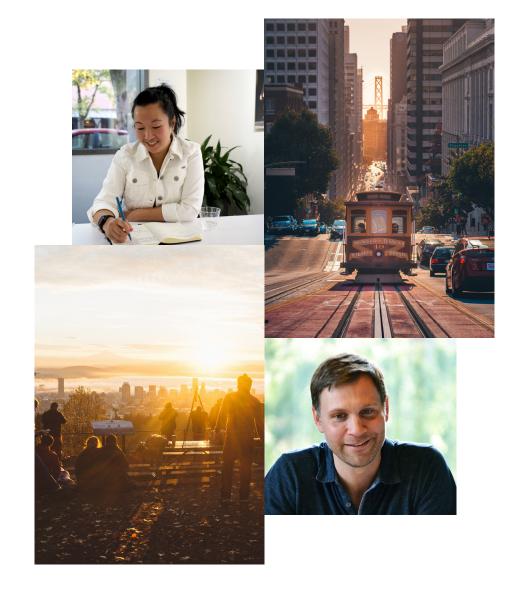

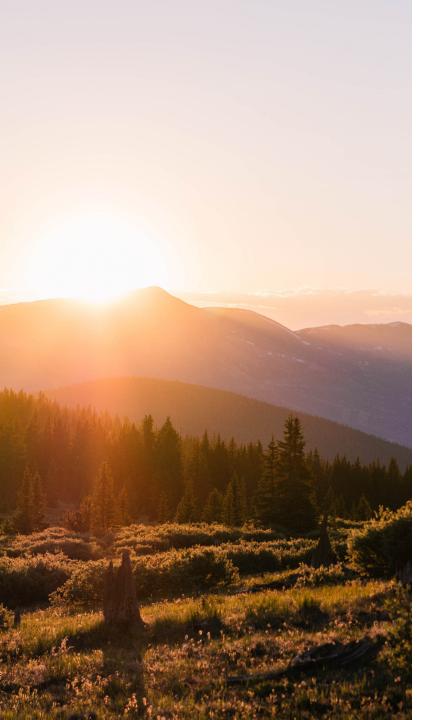
Selection criteria for our new office in San Francisco (and future offices) included sustainability standards, ensuring that our new location had the most up-to-date resource efficient technologies.

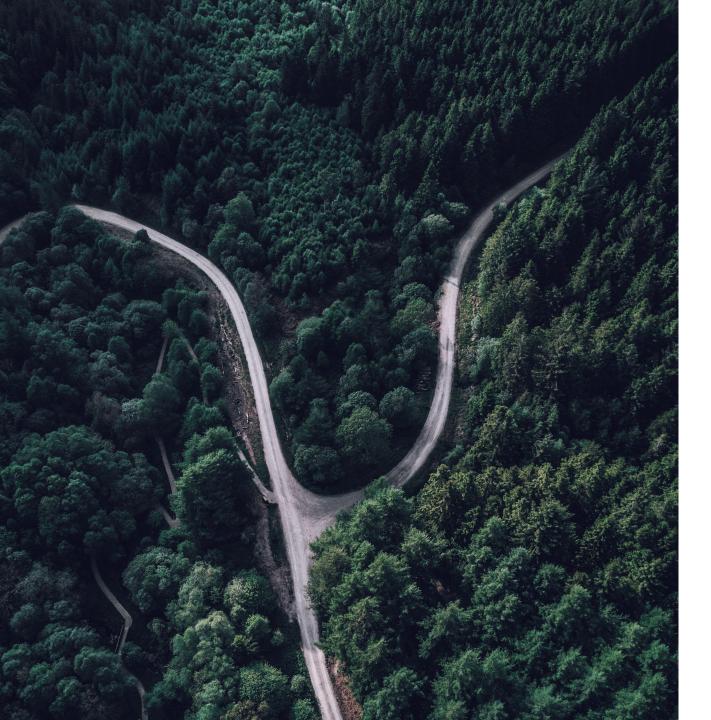






## **CLOSING THOUGHTS**

## **LOOKING AHEAD**

- Improving data collection and accuracy around our environmental impact, relying less on assumptions
- Establishing benchmarks within the Professional Services sector to measure ourselves against
- Auditing the implementation of our procurement policy and re-engaging internal staff on this recent change
- Training newly hired employees on the company's CSR and sustainability policies and best practices
- Upgrading old technologies (ex. auto-shut-off light switches, faucet aerators) at our offices (as permitted through our tenant agreement)
- Reducing our commuter miles through incentives and education
- Establishing guidelines for internally sponsored events and catering
- Explore creative ways to engage employees in volunteer efforts

   including open speed mentoring for nonprofit staff and build
